

# SURVIVE-TO-THRIVE: HOUSING

Lack of secure housing is the number one stressor to someone in poverty. If your participant lives in transitional housing or a motel, they are still homeless.

## SALVATION ARMY - PINETOP, AZ (NOT FULLY OPERATING AS OF 12/2021)

Salvation Army is a 90-day transitional, sober-living housing program. All participants are welcome to live there (minus sex offenders and some violent offenders) if they follow program guidelines. A big part of the program is job searching and securing employment. Participants are required to complete a certain number of applications each day. Once employment is secured, SA saves half of the participant's paycheck to help them secure permanent housing. If your participant is in this program, work with your participant on a plan for long-term housing. *\*As of 2021, they are only offering emergency, temporary housing.*

## VETERAN'S VILLAGE (WALKING DOWN RANCH) - LAKESIDE, AZ

Walking Down Ranch, Veterans Village is a unique community that offers veterans and their families various services, including transitional housing, food, clothes, utilities, medical transportation, phones, medications, and holiday boxes. Veteran's Village is the transitional housing portion of their services.

## WORD OF LIFE (HOMELESS SHELTER) - HOLBROOK, AZ

Bread of Life offers several vital services and programs to help the mission's guests get to a better place in life. Anyone homeless, stranded, or in need of a place to stay and whose income is below the State's income requirement. All guests who stay at the shelter meet with a Case Manager who determines the preferred length of stay. Typically, guests stay approximately up to four weeks. However, some guests stay longer based on their needs and circumstances. If needed, guests enrolled in our Life Change Program may have an extended stay. Guests staying at the shelter sleep in a comfortable bed, receive warm meals, a hot shower, and an opportunity to rest. Separate facilities exist for men, women, and women with children. The shelter is open 24 hours per day, except Sunday mornings from 8 am - 12 pm, so staff and guests have the opportunity to attend church. The mission's Case Manager makes referrals to other agencies when needed. Along with their guest, the Case Manager develops attainable, custom-designed goals and plans to accomplish their goals.

### **RECOVERY WORKS- SHOW LOW, AZ (MALE ONLY)**

RecoveryWorks is a state-licensed addiction recovery program specializing in treating substance use disorder in the adult population. Their primary focus is on exposing the human being behind the addiction to uncover an authentic healing experience. Their program consists of multiple therapeutic settings and with a frequency that varies on each patients' individualized treatment plan. Participants who are in their program can live in their supportive housing.

### **LIVING HOPE CENTER- SHOW LOW, AZ (FEMALE ONLY)**

Hope House Maternity Home is the place to go if a participant is pregnant or has small children and needs more support. This housing program is a safe place to live while mothers sort through their options. Staff also help participants reach their long-term goals of family stability.

### **VETERAN SERVICES USA- HOLBROOK, AZ (VETERANS ONLY)**

This housing option is a newer facility for veterans. They also assist low-income seniors. Their goal is to provide for the needs of America's veterans and seniors by offering services that include housing, education and training programs, healthcare, and mental health services.

### **OLD CONCHO COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE CENTER- NAVAJO & APACHE COUNTIES (RAPID REHOMING, EVICTION PREVENTION, AND RENTAL/MOVE-IN ASSISTANCE)**

OCCAC is a Homeless Management Information System-site (HMIS-site) with various options that offer financial assistance to those in need of secure housing. Each of their options/programs have different rules and qualifications. They provide motel vouchers, rent, utilities and utility deposits for homelessness prevention, and food referral services as funds are available.

We recommend participants call and schedule an intake appointment. During this appointment, they will assess the participant and determine what they qualify for in their current circumstances. Always remind the participant to ask about what documents they require (identification, proof of income, etc.). These intake appointments can be completed over the phone, whether using the RE:center's phones or the participant's phone.

## SOCIALSERVE USA- ONLINE (ANYONE)

Socialserve is a nonprofit, bilingual call center that connects people to housing and provides supportive, second chance employment. They provide professional housing location and listing services across the United States. They also assist displaced households in finding new housing, offer waiting list opening support, and gather housing data on behalf of many organizations across the country.

The RE:center is also an HMIS site (as of January 2022). Our team works with other housing agencies through the Navajo County Local Continuum to End Homelessness (NCLCEH). Monthly our RE:center leadership meets with local housing agencies to provide Coordinated Entry Case Conferencing (CECC) for qualifying individuals.
